DEATH OF FATHER FREDERICK A. MORLEY

Father Frederick A. Morley's death occurred very suddenly on Monday, June 3rd, 2019 at his residence on Xavier Drive, Sydney. Father Fred served as Parish Priest of many parishes in the Diocese and in Saint Peter's Parish, Tracadie from 1961-1967. Under his pastorate here, the Beavers' Club of the Holy Name Society was organized in 1965. This was and remains a very important fund raising committee. Also, under his pastorate, in 1964 the Saint Anne's Society was reorganized as a council of the Catholic Women's League of Canada. Father Fred always maintained a great interest in Saint Peter's Parish and would always ask about it when I would see him. Father Fred was a very good Pastor and he served in any way he could without any hesitance. Father Fred was the oldest priest in the Diocese in age and ordination. He was 96 years of age and 71 years a priest. His Funeral Mass took place on Friday, June 7th in his home Parish of Saint Anne's in Glace Bay where he was buried following in Saint Anne's Cemetery. SUMMER GRANT FOR THE PARISH

We have been informed that we were successful again this year in obtaining a grant from the Federal Government to hire a person for this summer for eight weeks for 30 hours a week. The grant will provide for the minimum wage which is now \$11.55 per hour with appropriate benefits and protection. The job will begin on July 2nd and conclude on August 26th. Applicants must comply with the eligibility requirements for the Canada Summer jobs 2019 program.

1. Applicants must be between the ages of 15 and 30 years of age at the start of the employment. to return to school on a full-time basis the next academic year;
2. are Canadian citizens or permanent residents or have official refugee protection status under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act (foreign students are not eligible);
3. are legally entitled to work in Canada according to relevant provincial/territorial legislation and regulations.

This is a call for Applications: They must be submitted and received by Wednesday, June 13th to Ms. Sheila Pelly, Chair of the Parish Council of Saint Peter's at: spelly@modg.ca or phone at (782) 452-2018. A special committee of the Parish Council will be appointed to conduct interviews and make the award of this job. The student will work under the supervision of Mr. Vern Stafford, our Parish Caretaker.
